Dr. Pace was a popular and highly respected member of the Northwestern faculty from 1974 until his retirement in 2015. He was honored by the University with Professor Emeritus status upon his retirement. During more than four decades of service to Northwestern, Dr. Pace was a positive influence on thousands of young people in the classroom and was widely recognized for his leadership in professional and civic activities.
