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GUIDELINES TO PUBLISHING REPORTED HAZING INCIDENTS

Information on Reported Hazing, with redactions in accordance to FERPA and HIPAA Acts, shall be made public on each institution's website; in addition, an institution may also make such information available on any platform related to hazing, such as brochures or other materials or other source of information that an organization or institution maintains or uses.

- 1. When an institution receives sufficiently credible and specific information about an alleged act of hazing, the institution or organization shall make the information on reported hazing public by placing on the institution's website.
- 2. The following information should be included:
 - Name of Organization
 - Date of Incident
 - Location of Incident
 - Status of Investigation
 - Discipline Status of the Organization
- 3. The hazing information should be publicized as follows:
 - Post to institution's Clery Act webpage under the category "Hazing."
 - Place a link to the Clery Act webpage on the institution's Hazing webpage.
- 4. Information should be updated and shall remain on the institution's website for a period of three years.
