Dear Dr. Henderson:

In a letter dated July 26, 2021, Southeastern Louisiana University requested and you granted administrative interim approval to appoint Dr. Tará Lopez as Interim Dean of the College of Business, effective July 31, 2021, at an annual salary rate of \$160,000. At this time, Southeastern requests Board consideration of Dr. Tará Lopez's interim dean appointment, retroactively effective July 31, 2021, at an annual salary of \$160,000. Dr. Lopez would replace Dr. Antoinette Phillips who has retired.

Dr. Lopez is a tenured Associate Professor who has served in the Department of Marketing and Supply Chain Management with a promotion to professor pending Board approval in August. She is a well-respected member of the faculty with over twenty years of college-level teaching experience and has numerous articles in quality academic journals. Dr. Lopez has successfully established and maintained domestic and international initiatives.
