Item I.1. Louisiana Tech University's request for approval to amend its Five-Year Capital Outlay submission to increase funding for the Central Steam Generator – Switch Gear Project.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Louisiana Tech University operates a co-generation power plant that provides electricity and steam for the campus. Volatile prices in natural gas, efficiencies of steam absorption airconditioning, and escalating cost of maintenance have made continued operation of the co-generation power plant infeasible. The University has been moving from a co-generation utility model to one of purchased electricity and steam generation. Funds have been appropriated to fund the project, but bids exceeded available funding. The University is requesting \$2,500,000 additional funds in order to re-bid and complete the project.

The Electronic Capital Outlay Request Tracking System (eCORTS) documents have been prepared and forwarded up to the Management Board level (eCORTS project number 576045).

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the following resolution be adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System hereby approves Louisiana Tech University's request for approval to amend its Five-Year Capital Outlay submission to increase funding for the Central Steam Generator – Switch Gear Project.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISIANA SYSTEM:

Louisiana Tech University operates a co-generation power plant that provides electricity and steam for the campus. Volatile prices in natural gas, efficiencies of steam absorption airconditioning and escalating cost of maintenance has made continued operation of the co-generation power plant infeasible.

The University has been changing energy consumption to move from the co-generation system. In working with the City of Ruston electrical connections for commercial electrical supply is being improved. The University will continue to have a need for steam when it is no longer generating electricity. This need for steam will require installation of new central plant boilers.

The last two years, the Legislature appropriated funds to replace the gas-fired turbine generator with two steam boilers and to upgrade electrical connection to the local electrical distribution system. The appropriated project was designed and bids were opened August 27, 2024. Bids were significantly over budget and efforts to value engineer the bid within available funds were unsuccessful.

Louisiana Tech University is requesting that the Capital Outlay request be amended to include an additional \$2,500,000 to allow re-bidding and completion of this essential project.

Continued technology changes in air conditioning efficiency has made steam absorption air conditioning no longer efficient and the equipment is not competitively manufactured. The University continues to replace steam absorption air conditioning equipment with more efficient electric air conditioning. In 2004, the generation of electricity produced approximately 90% of the steam needed to heat and cool the campus. In 2020, gas was used to create steam that was necessary beyond the steam exhausted from the electrical generation process. With the air conditioning conversion of two buildings in 2021, there is no point in time that steam is needed beyond the steam created in the electrical generation process. There are significant times of each day that 60% of the steam produced from the exhaust of the gas turbine is vented into the atmosphere, wasting treated water and creating additional inefficiencies. We are proposing to install a new boiler or boilers to replace the gas turbine. All electricity needed by the campus will be purchased from the City of Ruston. We propose to replace the 1985 electrical switchgear at the Power Plant with new switchgear to better interface with the City of Ruston power distribution system. This project was completely designed and bid by the Office of Facility Planning and Control. Bids exceeded appropriated funds by \$1,700,000. The switchgear portion of the project is being re-bid by Facility Planning and control. The Steam Generator portion of this project requires additional funding in order to re-bid and award a contract.



Item I.4. University of Louisiana at Lafayette's request for authorization to enter into an Act of Donation for the acquisition of properties from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette Foundation.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Pursuant to La. R.S. 17:3351(2), the Board is authorized to "Actively seek and accept donations, bequests, or other forms of financial assistance for educational purposes from any public or private person or agency and to comply with rules and regulations governing grants from the federal government or any other person or agency which are not in contravention of the constitution and laws." The University of Louisiana at Lafayette has agreed to acquire by donation properties located at 524 and 527 Roosevelt Street, Lafayette, Louisiana, from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette Foundation to benefit the University. The Foundation Properties are adjacent to properties acquired and owned by the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System.

Upon approval by the Board, the University of Louisiana at Lafayette will proceed with the assistance of System staff, legal counsel, and any other appropriate State agencies to move forward with the execution of an Act of Donation for the acquisition of the Foundation Properties in conformity with Louisiana laws and regulations.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the following resolution be adopted:

- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System hereby approves University of Louisiana at Lafayette's request for authorization to enter into an Act of Donation for the acquisition of properties from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette Foundation.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the University of Louisiana at Lafayette has obtained final review from UL System staff, legal counsel, and shall secure all other appropriate approvals from agencies/parties of processes, documents, and administrative requirements prior to execution of documents.

BE IT KNOWN, that on the day and dates hereinafter written, before the undersigned Notaries Public, duly commissioned and qualified in and for the Parish of Lafayette, Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared:

UNIVERSITY OF LOUISIANA AT LAFAYETTE FOUNDATION, a non-profit corporation duly organized, validly existing under the laws of the State of Louisiana, domiciled in Lafayette Parish, Louisiana, represented herein by John Blohm, its duly authorized Chief Executive Officer, whose mailing address is P. O. Box 44290, Lafayette, LA 70504 (hereinafter referred to as "DONOR");

who declares that DONOR does by these presents irrevocably give, grant, alienate, confirm, donate inter vivos, convey, transfer and deliver all of its right, title and interest that it has or may have of whatever nature or kind unto:

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISIANA SYSTEM, a public constitutional corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Louisiana, acting herein with and on the behalf of the University of Louisiana at Lafayette, herein represented by the President of the University, E. Joseph Savoie, duly authorized to execute all necessary documents, whose mailing address is P. O. Drawer 41008, Lafayette, LA 70504 (hereinafter referred to as "DONEE");

all of Donor's rights, title and interest in and to the following described properties ("Property"), to-wit:

1. Three certain lots of ground with all improvements thereon and thereunto belonging, situated in the College Park Addition near the Southeastern limits of the City Lafayette, Louisiana, and being lots number Twentytwo, Twenty-three and Twenty-four of Block One of College Park Addition, measuring each twenty-five (25) feet front on Roosevelt Street by the depth in parallel lines of one hundred and forty (140) feet and bounded as follows: Northeast by Lot Number Twenty-five of said Block; Southeast by Roosevelt Street; Southwest by Tulane Avenue; Northwest by an alley, all according to V. E. Smith's plat of said Addition filed in the Clerk's Office of Lafayette Parish.

ALSO, that certain strip of ground, six feet in width, and abutting said lots along the rear thereof, and being the half of the alley, adjoining and in the rear of said lots, which reverted to the then-owner of said lots by the abandonment of said alley by the City of Lafayette, Louisiana, by ordinance adopted November 22, 1938.

Item I.5. University of New Orleans' request for approval to enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement ("CEA") and related transactional documents, including but not limited to a mortgage, with the Ogden Museum of Southern Art, Inc., for the transfer of the Goldring Hall to the Ogden Museum of Southern Art, Inc., on terms and conditions acceptable to the Board and for consideration of money and/or services with a stated value not being less than the appraised value. The CEA is accordance with Article VII Section 14(C) of the Louisiana Constitution and Act 485 of the 2024 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The University has been presented with an agreement to acquire Goldring Hall, located at 925 Camp Street near Lee Circle and the National World War II D-Day Museum. The building is state-owned and construction was completed in August 2003, when the University was a part of the Louisiana State University System. The building currently serves as the only operating portion of the Ogden Museum of Southern Art ("OMSA"). The University acquired the property by donation from the University of New Orleans Foundation in 1999. Designed specifically as a museum, the physical structure is six stories and contains approximately 60,000 square feet of exhibition and office space. OMSA is operated by the Ogden Museum of Southern Art, Inc., a private, non-profit corporation established to promote the well-being and advancement of the Ogden Museum of Southern Art.

Goldring and the Patrick F. Taylor Memorial Library, located at 615 Andrew Higgins Boulevard, New Orleans, Louisiana, were initially envisioned as a downtown arts complex that would serve OMSA and support the teaching mission of the UNO Fine Arts Department. This Agreement will allow OMSA to continue serving the UNO constituency as well as the New Orleans Region by supporting the arts and related educational opportunities through its philanthropic efforts. UNO maintains sufficient other art facilities that support its current needs, including the St. Claude Gallery and the UNO Fine Arts Gallery. UNO has continuously provided for certain utilities, property and casualty insurance for the premises since construction. The current occupant, OMSA desires to acquire title and ownership of the building and maintain a cooperative relationship with the University.

Article VII Section 14(C) further allows for the public bodies to enter into such agreements with non-profit entities that further carry out the mission of the University. Additionally, Act 485 of the 2024 Regular Legislative Session further allowed for the direct transfer of the building and improvements to OMSA for appropriate consideration in compliance with Article VII Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the following resolution be adopted.

- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System hereby approves University of New Orleans' request for approval of the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement and related documents providing for the transfer of the property to the Ogden Museum of Southern Art, Inc.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the University of New Orleans has obtained final review from UL System staff, legal counsel, and shall secure all other appropriate approvals from agencies/parties of processes, documents, and administrative requirements prior to execution of documents.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the President of the University of New Orleans and/or his designee are hereby designated and authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to execute this transaction.
- **AND FURTHER,** that the University of New Orleans will provide the System office with copies of all final executed documents for Board files.
